#### Questions to Discuss:

- 1) Read Psalm 21:1-7
  - a. What verses stand out to you? Why?
  - b. Why is it important to see that we read these verses in community?
  - c. Why is it important to know that Jesus is our ultimate King?
- 2) Read Psalm 21:8-13
  - a. What do these verses make you think about?
  - b. What do these verses make you feel?
  - c. How are these verses, ultimately, a comfort to you?
  - d. How do you have to wrestle with these verses on this side of Heaven?
- 3) Engaging in the Battle
  - a. Do you feel like you are one who Christ has redeemed?
    - i. If not, take some time to consider what keeps you from trusting in Him.
  - b. If you are a part of Christ's body, are you part of a local church?
    - i. If not, take some time to consider how you are pursuing that.
  - c. If you are a part of our church, where do you need to grow?
    - i. How can you help others grow?
    - ii. What can you be praying for?
    - iii. How does Psalm 21 bring you confidence and thanksgiving, even in our stage right now?
